**PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR**

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION/REFERENDUM VOTE OF THE TOWN OF LIVONIA, LIVINGSTON COUNTY, NEW YORK, FOR THE APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL OF A PROPOSITION RELATING TO THE FORMATION OF THE TOWN OF LIVONIA CENTRAL LIVONIA WATER DISTRICT AND PROVIDING FOR WATER IMPROVEMENTS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, SUCH DISTRICT HAVING BEEN FORMED SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM, BY RESOLUTION NO. 20 OF 2025, DATED JANUARY 22, 2025.

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board of the Town of Livonia, Livingston County, New York, has heretofore, on January 22, 2025, duly adopted Resolution No. 20 of 2025, creating the Town of Livonia Central Livonia Water District (hereafter "Central Livonia Water District") and providing for the construction of improvements therein, which such Resolution was adopted subject to permissive referendum pursuant to New York State Town Law Article 12A and Article 7; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 12, 2025, within thirty (30) days following the adoption of Resolution No. 20 of 2025 forming the Central Livonia Water District subject to permissive referendum, the Livonia Town Clerk received seventy-four (74) properly authenticated petition signatures of property owners within the proposed Central Livonia Water District, seeking to compel a special election/referendum vote on the formation of the district, which such signatures represent more than five percent (5%) of the number of owners of real property located within the proposed district, based upon the latest assessment rolls for the Town of Livonia; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 92 of the New York State Town Law, the Town Clerk has prepared and transmitted to this Board a form of proposition for the approval of such Resolution creating the Central Livonia Water District and authorizing improvements therein, and which contains an abstract concisely stating the purpose and effect thereof, which such proposition is set forth below; and

**WHEREAS**, it is now desired to provide for the holding of a special election/ referendum vote for a proposition for the approval or disapproval of the formation of the Town of Livonia Central Livonia Water District and the authorization of certain improvements therein and to provide for the notice of such special election/referendum vote.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Town Board of the Town of Livonia, Livingston County, New York, as follows:

1. A special election/referendum vote of the Town of Livonia, Livingston County, New York, shall be held on **May 21, 2025**, for the purpose of submitting a proposition for the approval or disapproval of the formation of the Town of Livonia Central Livonia Water District. The place of holding such special election/referendum vote shall be at the Livonia Town Hall, 35 Commercial Street, Livonia, New York 14487, and the polls for such special election/referendum vote shall be kept open for the purpose of voting on such proposition between the hours of **12:00 Noon and 8:00 P.M.**, Eastern Standard Time. The proposition to be submitted at said special election/referendum vote shall be in substantially the format hereinafter set forth in the form of notice of such special election/referendum vote; and it is further resolved, that
2. Any person qualified to vote in the State of New York and who is a property owner of real property located within the proposed Town of Livonia Central Livonia Water District may vote upon the proposition to be submitted at the aforesaid special election/referendum vote; and it is further resolved, that
3. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of said special election/referendum vote by publication of a notice at least once in a newspaper published in the Town, or if there be none, a newspaper published in the county having general circulation in the Town, said publication to be made at least ten (10) days prior to the date of said special election/referendum vote. In addition, the Town Clerk shall cause a copy of such notice to be posted on the sign-board of the Town at least ten (10) days prior to the date of said special election/referendum vote. Such notice

shall be in substantially the following form, to wit:

## **NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION/REFERENDUM VOTE**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special Town election/referendum vote in and for the Town of Livonia, Livingston County, New York, will be held on May 21, 2025, at the Livonia Town Hall, 35 Commercial Street, Livonia, New York 14487, at which the polls will remain open between the hours of 12:00 o'clock Noon and 8:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, for the purpose of voting on the following described proposition by persons qualified to vote in the State of New York that are owners of real property located within the proposed Town of Livonia Central Livonia Water District:**

### **PROPOSITION**

**On January 22, 2025, the Livonia Town Board (the “Board”) adopted a resolution (the “Resolution”), subject to permissive referendum, to form the Town of Livonia Central Livonia Water District (the “Water District”), as shown on the legal description in the Map, Plan and Report dated October, 2024.**

**The Resolution also provides for the installation of approximately 125,350 linear feet of 8-inch water main, a pump station, fire hydrants and valves to serve approximately 365 properties along portions of Pennemite Road, Vanzandt Road, Densmore Road, South Livonia Road, Cadyville Road, Cleary Road, Price Road, Decker Road, Backus Road, Holmes Hill Road, Coe Road, Niver Road, Federal Road, Adams Road, Blank Road, Lindsley Road and Richmond Mills Road.**

**The maximum authorized expenditure for these water improvements totals \$14,260,000.00 - of that amount, \$8,150,000.00 is anticipated to come from a USDA-Rural Development grant, and the remaining \$6,110,000.00 is anticipated to be financed over 38 years through a low interest USDA-Rural Development loan.**

**For the typical property in the Water District, the anticipated annual cost, calculated on a benefit basis, is estimated to be \$1,078.00 (which includes debt service and typical water usage).**

**One-time property owner expenses will include connection cost of approximately \$4,150.00, which includes: 1) installation of a service**

line at approximately \$30.00 per linear foot, comprising \$3,000.00 of the connection costs on average (dependent on contractor used and distance from service at property boundary to point of entry at house or building); 2) an estimated \$500.00 for well isolation and interior plumbing modifications (dependent on existing interior plumbing); and 3) a fixed fee of \$650.00 to the Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority (which includes a new water meter).

**DISCUSSION**

Supervisor Gott advised there is NOT a sewer project following this water project and stated it is disheartening the misinformation that has circulated since day one from an individual. He said that no person on this board should be ridiculed for any reason for this project, and it is his wish for the misinformation to stop. He proposed for the Town Board to put out large ads and pay whatever cost necessary to make sure every resident is aware of all the facts. Councilmember English shared in his opinion he is glad it got to this point and now the majority will rule, and it will not be brought up again after whatever the people in that district vote. He personally believes it would benefit the community as a whole, but the people will speak and now it is on the people it will affect.

Councilmember Gascon shared that in the last nineteen years and three months he has been on this Board, never once has sewer been brought up in this project, but it is very clear our people need water.

Ben Woodruff asked if the vote would change the timeline of the project in regards to funding deadlines, and also if it does move forward will there be a financial impact for missing the deadline because of the vote. Attorney Campbell advised he remains hopeful that Clark Patterson will have time to get the WIYA application after the vote. There have been rumblings of delaying the WIYA deadline. As far as cost, even if delayed, Eric Wies has expressed that with built in numbers and contingencies he would hope to keep the financial situation the same. A Resident asked about the last gubernatorial election part of the voting requirements. Attorney Campbell explained there are different referendum requirements, and this is a special district, so it is not the same. To vote a person does not have to be an elector, they can vote if they own property.

A resident questions the legitimacy of the petitions due to the misinformation put out on social media by a certain individual. He wants to know if legally these petitions should be accepted. Campbell advised there is a 5-day window from when the petitions were submitted to be to be disputed, and that time has passed. We must assume that people read the document and signed based on what was written on the petition. A resident advised that there has been an absolute misrepresentation of this project by this individual.

## **INTRODUCTION OF LOCAL LAW #2-2025-RESIDENCY OF DEPUTY TOWN CLERK**

### **LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF THE YEAR 2025 OF THE TOWN OF LIVONIA**

A local law Amending the Code of the Town of Livonia.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Livonia as follows:

#### **SECTION 1. TITLE AND SCOPE**

A. This local law shall be known as "A Local Law Establishing the Residency Requirements for the Appointed Office of Deputy Town Clerk for the Town of Livonia."

## **SECTION 2. PURPOSE AND LEGISLATIVE INTENT**

The Town Board recognizes that NYS Public Officers Law § 3 and NYS Town Law § 23 generally require that elected and appointed officers of the Town of Livonia must be residents and electors of the Town of Livonia. In order to expand the field from which a Deputy Town Clerk may be selected and appointed by the Town Clerk, or when such appointment by the Town Clerk has not occurred and the Town Clerk is absent or unable to act and appointment of a Deputy Town Clerk by the Town Board has occurred pursuant to NYS Town Law §30 10. (b), it is the intent of this Town Board, by this local law, to supersede, and amend, those sections of law, as well as Chapter 38 of the Livonia Town Code, so as to provide that the person appointed to and holding the office of Deputy Town Clerk of the Town of Livonia need not be a resident or elector of the Town of Livonia, so long as they are a resident of Livingston County, New York.

## **SECTION 3. AUTHORITY**

This article is adopted pursuant to NYS Municipal Home Rule Law §§ 10(1)(i) and 10(1)(ii)(a)(1) which grants to local governments the authority to enact local laws pertaining to the qualifications of local officers. Moreover, the Town Board recognizes that the State Legislature has, on various occasions, for various offices, including that of a Deputy Town Clerk, in various municipalities, amended NYS Public Officers Law § 3 and NYS Town Law §23 so as to create exceptions to the general residency requirements as set forth in those statutes, thereby rendering said statutes to be special laws, rather than general laws, insofar as the office of a Deputy Town Clerk is concerned. Accordingly, this Town Board may supersede, and amend, NYS Public Officers Law § 3 and NYS Town Law § 23 as regards the residency requirements for the appointed office of Deputy Town Clerk of the Town of Livonia.

## **SECTION 4. RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT**

Hereafter, the person appointed to and holding the office of Deputy Town Clerk of the Town of Livonia need not be a resident or elector of the Town of Livonia, provided that such person is a resident of Livingston County, New York.

## **SECTION 5. SUPERSESSION**

This article shall supersede the residency requirements set forth in NYS Public Officers Law § 3 and NYS Town Law § 23 in regard to their application to the appointed office of Deputy Town Clerk of the Town of Livonia.

## SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY

Should any clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section, or part of this article be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation of the clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered.

## SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall be effective immediately upon its filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.

Annual Report for 2024

## **Operations**

- 1,229 calls for service
- Two members completed Paramedic Class
- Increased ALS coverage to nearly 80% for primary calls
- Primary BLS Coverage was 100% for primary calls

## **District**

- 2024 highlight was communicating with residents through the mailing. Educating the citizens who rely on our services as to the current and future needs was a high priority. Received only positive responses (~200 letters). Looking at ways to continue to update the public
- A major ongoing concern has been the lack of ALS coverage. Outside of pay and benefits, how can we draw providers?

## **Fly Cars**

- 2006 Tahoe was taken out of service in 2023. New Ford Interceptor was purchased through state bid pricing, lettered, outfitted for under \$55k, and placed into service in December as Chief Car (ALS equipped)
- In January, purchased another 2024 Ford Interceptor to replace the 2012 Tahoe. One was on the lot in Avon. Currently being lettered and outfitted (Medic 75).
- The Agency also operates a 2019 Chevy Tahoe. (Medic 74)

## **New Cardiac Monitors/ALS Equipment**

- Cardiac monitors were out of date and no longer able to be serviced. Reports of similar units failing in the field. The cost of a new unit is \$100k each. Last year, a lease program was established for two units at \$20k each per year for 3 years.
- With Chief Allen becoming a paramedic and additional paramedics joining, we have seen an increase in ALS coverage. A third cardiac monitor lease was approved starting this year. This allows us to have up to 3 paramedics equipped at the same time but more importantly allows for a backup set if one needs repairs. Additional equipment was also purchased to complete this third set.

## **Major Budget adjustments/changes**

- Insurance billing revenues exceeded estimates. Collection rate is around 92% of what is billed. Allowed funds to be put into capital reserves for the first time in 3 years

## **Major purchases**

- 5 new AEDs received through Firehouse Subs grant. Old units were donated to organizations within the town

## **Cost savings**

- Operations staff continue to do an excellent job at using a variety of vendors to purchase supplies. Weighing cost vs availability vs delivery time

## **Notable policy changes**

- We are working with the Town to transition to paid staffing as well as potentially transitioning to an independent corporation and not a special use district

- We are currently exploring staffing options that will maintain if not improve the current levels (100% primary calls, 50% 2nd, 3rd calls) as well as ALS coverage.

- There are many moving pieces to this, including HR, scheduling, billing, payroll, benefits, insurance, etc as well as making sure reserves will meet equipment replacement needs

- Most important concern is how to staff 2nd and 3rd ambulance calls without the incentive program and without having to pay overtime

- Goal is to have a staffing model in place by June to allow for budgeting and have the new corporation take over operations as of January 1, 2026

- Only way to increase revenue is to increase the call volume (cover more territory) or to use tax dollars

- Call volume: looking at 1, 5 and 10 years, numbers are very consistent: Town of Livonia 62%, Town of Conesus 16%, Out of town 22%. 5 year insurance revenue breakdown matches call volume

## **Future Planning**

- With interest rates up, we did establish a CD. Ambulance services do not qualify for NYCLASS (would as an entity of the town)

## **Ambulance Replacement**

- Next 3 ambulances will need to be complete units (cannot reuse existing "box". First replacement is due 2028-9. Exploring any and all options

- Leasing is not an option: too much mileage

- Moving from Ford E to F chassis: improve ride/handling

- Upgrade to 4 wheel drive: more houses being built off road (cost for adding 4-wheel is negligible) More calls in further out areas

- For crew and patient safety, looking at upgrading gurneys to auto-loaders

- The goal is to bid and order a unit by the end of this year for delivery in 2028. Approximate cost is going to be around \$400,000. Currently, TLAD has around \$150k in capital reserves

## **Challenges**

- Increasing costs with little funds going into reserves

## **DISCUSSION ON VITALE PARK CONCERT SERIES**
