Board of Trustees Meeting

February 9th, 2022

Present: Mayor Cal Lathan, Rhonda Roeser, Chris Genthner, Annette Meade and Chris Hoffmann.

Guest: Jason Molino, Executive Director at LCWSA.

Excused: Bill Kurtz and Dan Coon.

Mayor Lathan called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

M/2/C (C. Lathan, C. Genthner) to approve the minutes from the January 26th, 2022 meeting. Passed 3 to 0. There were no comments.

M/2/C (C. Genthner, A. Meade) to approve the payment of claims #194 to #207 in the amount of \$12,235.10. Passed 3 to 0. Trustee Meade asked about Voucher #202 made payable to American Rock Salt. Chris Hoffmann stated that the Rock Salt budget is still under budget.

A Conversation with Jason Molino (Executive Director at LCWSA)
Jason Molino began the discussion by stating that the intersection on Big Tree has been completed. Saddle replacements on Shelly Road were also completed.
Landscaping will be done in the Spring. It will be necessary to have a conversation with the Livonia School District regarding unit charges. This process may cause a jump in price for the School District. New water and sewer line extensions will be necessary for the new Livonia School District Transportation Building.
Complaints have been received at LCWSA concerning cloudy water in several homes on Spring Street. An old four inch line may be responsible for this problem. The water authority will do some exploratory digging and if necessary they will replace the old line.

Throughout the Village of Livonia, Water Meter replacement will begin midsummer. LCWSA plans on hiring additional workers for this project. This Spring LCWSA will do smoke testing for weaknesses in the sewer lines. The dates for this project will be provided so as not to alarm residents. Next year (2023) planning has begun for a new Water Storage Tank which will help with water pressure and provide additional water storage. The location of this new water tank will be decided soon, several locations are being considered. Water and sewer rates will be looked at. LCWSA may consolidate the rate system. Another area that needs to be updated and upgraded is the alarm system. An automated system will help with efficiency and leaks.

Around Memorial Day a Livingston County wide project will take place to check the leak detection system. This may take approximately one week.

Chris Genthner asked about an Emergency Notification System to contact residents. Jason Molino left the Board Meeting at 7:40 pm.
